### Module 1: Management of Personnel Security Program

- Understanding the purpose of the PSP and the five key elements.
- Identifying sensitive positions and duties and security office responsibilities.
- Discussing HSPD-12 and its impact on personnel security management.

### Module 2: Adjudication Guidelines

- Exploring the role of adjudication in security clearances and personnel security.
- Applying adjudication guidelines to investigative cases.
- Evaluating the relevance of adjudication guidelines in making eligibility determinations.

### Module 3: Review and Evaluation of Investigative Request Packages

- Identifying the types of investigations and their relevance to different duties.
- Learning how to request and process investigations properly.
- Identifying potential issues in evaluating investigative packages.

### Module 4: Control of Reports

- Understanding the procedures for handling personnel security reports.
- Ensuring secure control of sensitive security information and access rights.

### Module 5: Granting Security Clearances

- Understanding the process and authority behind granting security clearances.
- Learning the criteria for issuing security clearances and the handling of interim clearances.

### Module 6: Continuous Evaluation Program and Suspension of Access

- Exploring the continuous evaluation program and its application to personnel in sensitive positions.
- Learning the procedures for suspending access if concerns arise about loyalty, trustworthiness, or reliability.
